Description: Internships provide an excellent opportunity to gain experience in a wide spectrum of environmental management project work and cross-organizational exposure.

The Laguna Foundation has internships available in the Restoration Department. Interns will assist with a wide variety of restoration project work including native plant propagation, installation, maintenance and monitoring of plantings, invasive weed management, irrigation installation and maintenance, mapping, and collecting and compiling restoration project data. Work on research studies, GPS/GIS and other special projects may also be available.

Cotati Creek Critters is seeking interns to help host community attended Creek Stewardship Days primarily to maintain existing restoration plantings by pruning, mulching, weeding, etc. Additional opportunities for community outreach and education may also be available.

Qualifications: Ability to perform physical work outdoors in variable weather conditions and on uneven terrain. Candidates must be reliable, motivated, with good communication skills. Must have reliable transportation to organizational facilities & project sites. Familiarity with MS Office software a plus. GPS/GIS, bilingual skills useful but not necessary.
